TelPay Celebrates Earth Day, Every Day

TelPay is Canada's leader in electronic payment processing, allowing Canadian businesses to perform their payroll and bill payment functions without the use of paper cheques! By eliminating paper cheques, TelPay estimates that in 2009, it was able to save:

- 77,500 kilograms of paper (171,000 lbs)
- Over 2000 trees
- 3.8 million pounds of greenhouse gases from being released
 - This is equivalent to:
 - 3.8 million miles driven by car
 - Nearly 76,000 litres of gasoline
 - 45,000 trees planted and grown for ten years
 - 12 acres of deforestation
- Over six million litres of waste water from being discharged
- Eight dump trucks worth of waste from paper production
- Nearly 350,000 litres of gasoline from being consumed due to mailing bills, statements, and payments
